SUSTAINABLE FOOD SOLUTIONS FOR THE URBAN JUNGLE: FOX URBAN FARMS



Most people do not imagine growing five acres of food on a quarter acre of gravel when they look at an infill property in a city, but that is exactly what Ann and John Fox saw when they surveyed 1001 S Loudoun St.

Fox Urban Farms LLC grows fresh greens, microgreens, herbs, and edible flowers using hydroponics within two enormous containers painted with eye-catching paintings by Sarah Gallahan. After 16 years of serving the public through Greenwood Grocery & Deli, they decided to figure out how they might best serve the community in the future while also freeing up their lifestyle after the deli's grueling hours.

Because the containers are totally enclosed, hydroponics allows the Foxes to give safe, wholesome food without having to worry about bugs or pesticides. Hanging seedling trays are automatically irrigated, and timed illumination sends the sun's rays inside regardless of the weather. Setting their own planting schedule allows them to spend more time with their family and devote more time to local charities they care about, such as recently helping update the paint in the cafe at the Winchester Rescue Mission.

Residents can pick up pre-ordered items or choose their selections when they arrive every Saturday. The Foxes also make sauces and other sides from leftover plants and supply speciality goods to nearby eateries. Edible flowers are high on their list of products they want to sell more of, and local chefs are enthusiastic about the idea. Our editors just enjoyed a delicious salad that included edible flowers from the gardens at a Literacy Volunteers fundraising wine supper prepared by D.A.H. Cuisines chef Kesha Harris.

As Winchester struggles with food deserts, the Foxes are pleased to announce that they will now accept government food benefit program payments, which will benefit the surrounding community. They also enjoy receiving stories about how long their products last in the refrigerator versus store-bought products.

FOUR SQUARE ARCHITECT KYLE HOPKINS REVITALIZES THE PAST

Piccadilly St is currently seeing a rebirth in the reuse of old buildings, with Four Square Architects, led by Kyle Hopkins, at the forefront of several projects. Walking through Old Town, you might be familiar with some of their recent projects, such as the transformation of an abandoned gas station into Pizzoco on North Loudoun Street, the Sarah Zane firehouse remodel, and the town homes currently under construction at the corner of Piccadilly and Kent Streets. Other future projects include Paladin's new location, which will have the city's first rooftop dining, and Four Square's new offices in the former flower store on Piccadilly.

We were pleased to talk with Kyle about his vision and what it's like to be involved in so many projects that have a real visual impact in Old Town. Kyle loves to integrate historical accuracy with modern enhancements by drawing inspiration from such things as roof lines and historical uses of structures.

The black subway tile on the exterior of the flower store building, for example, was chosen to resemble the black stone that was originally on the lower half of the building. The flower artwork over the door pays homage to the building's historical usage, and he plans to save the greenhouse installed in the 1940s.

"I enjoy dealing with historic structures... That's one of my favorite things to do, especially when you can breathe fresh life into them in a creative way that's not just restoration." Kyle's enthusiasm shines through as he talks project elements such as the flow of the new Paladin with a degree of detail that includes the style of serving ware that will be utilized at the bar.

As a group of real estate agents who lament poor design that frequently works against how we live our lives in our homes and commercial spaces, we always look forward to seeing the finished projects developed by Four Square architects. 
Winchester Book Gallery Recommends:

As self-proclaimed Winchester ambassadors, we frequently hear that access to nature is one of local folks' favorite aspects of living here. Blandy Experimental Farms and the Virginia State Arboretum are among the many attractions in Winchester that provide far more than you may realize. On a beautiful spring day, this reporter was given a private tour by the head of public relations, Stephanie Swaim, to discuss everyday activities and the 33rd Garden Fair, which returns on Mother's Day this year.

Graham Blandy donated 712 acres from the Tuleyries estate to the University of Virginia in 1924 to be used to instruct college students in farming skills. While we may not notice it when strolling the various trails, the farm is still an active field study site with students, and every tree has been cataloged and labelled to aid in identification. While most people are familiar with the ginko grove and dogwood lane, there is also a new sundial to relax by, a conifer path, herb garden, iris garden, native plant trail, wild flowers galore, and even horse trailer parking for riding the trails together.

One current experiment you can visually see happening is an ecological restoration project in which a former hayfield that was expected to naturally develop into a diverse forest was instead overrun by non-native buckthorn and autumn olive trees, forming an impenetrable thicket and preventing the establishment of larger canopy trees and under soil vegetation. Funding has been awarded to the project to test multiple methods of invasive tree eradication and native tree regeneration on a 2.5-acre area. As we drove by we could see some of the methods used and will be able to compare as the new vegetation grows.

If you've never been to Blandy, the Garden Fair is a terrific time to go. Blandy's trademark Garden Fair will be held May 12-14, featuring vendors and plant sales, food trucks, music, and refreshments for the members-only preview on Friday night. ENJOYING THE OUTDOORS WITH YOUR FOUR-LEGGED FRIEND

Choose the right time: Avoid walking your dog during the hottest hours of the day, typically between 10 AM and 4 PM. Instead, opt for early morning or evening walks when the temperature is cooler.

Hydrate frequently: Always bring water for your dog to drink during the walk, and take frequent water breaks. You can also wet your dog's fur with water to help them cool down.

Protect their paws: Hot pavement and sand can burn your dog's paws. Consider walking on grass or in shaded areas, or invest in protective booties for your dog's paws.

Watch for signs of overheating: Dogs can quickly overheat in hot weather, leading to heat stroke. Watch for signs such as excessive panting, lethargy, vomiting, and collapse. If you suspect your dog is overheating, seek veterinary attention immediately.
